Treasurer's Report

We are pleased to report a Net Profit for the 2024/25 financial year of almost \$9,000, another positive result following on from the previous financial year.

The strong result has been through the continuing good performance of Clarence on the Bay, along with prudent management of funds received from players, sponsors, and Cricket Tasmania. I thank all of our valued sponsors for their support of, and investment in, the club. I also thank Cricket Tasmania for their continued support and development of cricket pathways, in particular the development of junior cricketers to achieve their goals and ambitions. With so many competitors to this great game, it is important to engage and empower clubs and players to maintain high standards of play.

The ability to generate revenue outside of player subscriptions allows Clarence Cricket Club to maintain these at an affordable and competitive level for all, providing great value given the quality of practice and clubroom facilities. For this reason, we hope that Clarence District Cricket Club continues to be seen as a destination club for those wishing to pursue this great sport.

Our biggest expense, outside of the cost of bar stock, was employee expenses of over \$72,000. Over the course of the financial year the club also employed Rikki as Club Co-ordinator to assist in improving both cricket and facility operations. While now having relinquished this role, on behalf of the club I wish to thank Rikki for her efforts during the financial year, and wish her well for all future endeavours.

During the year the club also continued investment in our club volunteers, who help make Clarence District Cricket Club the great club it is. By making payments to scorers, Junior Co-ordinator and Blast Co-ordinators hopefully indicates the value the club sees in their efforts and dedication, and maintains a high standard of support for our programs. We certainly wish we could do more to acknowledge our volunteers, but please know that you are greatly appreciated and essential to our success.

Our facilities, the best of all clubs, also saw investment during the year, with repainting, lighting and electrical works, and security camera upgrades all taking place. Such improvements maintain attractiveness for hirers, as well as safety for all.

I would like thank our President, Craig Rainbird, for ongoing oversight of our club, along with our Secretary Annie Curtis, who effectively manages and co-ordinates the Committee to ensure we all follow through on our actions. Independent Auditor's Report to the members of Clarence District Cricket Club Inc

Report on the Audit of the Financial Report

Opinion

I have audited the financial report, being a special purpose financial report, of Clarence District Cricket Club Inc, which comprises the balance sheet as of 30 June 2025, the income & expenditure statement and statement of cash flows for the financial year then ended, notes to the financial statements, and the responsible persons' declaration.

In my opinion, the financial report of Clarence District Cricket Club Inc for the financial year ended 30 June 2025 has been prepared in all material respects, in accordance with the accounting policies disclosed at Notes 1 & 2 to the financial statements.

Basis for Opinion

I conducted my audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. My responsibilities under those standards are further described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Report* section of my report. I am independent of the Entity in accordance with the auditor independence requirements of the ethical requirements of the Accounting Professional and Ethical Standards Board's *APES 110 Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants (including Independence Standards)* (the Code) that are relevant to my audit of the financial report in Australia. I have also fulfilled my other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the Code.

My opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.

Captain's Report – Men's 1st Grade

Season 24-25 for the first grade men's team was a season of two halves. After winning only two games prior to Christmas, we then went on a tear winning all but 1 game post-Christmas.

Unfortunately, it wasn't enough for us to sneak into finals and we finished the overall season in 5th only 4 points behind 3rd & 4th. It showed tremendous spirit and fight on behalf of the team to pick themselves up off the canvas and play some exceptional cricket in the back half of the season. I think this is a sign of the group that we have coming through and that never say die attitude which I am sure will lead us to bigger and better things in season 25-26.

The white-ball campaigns never really got off the ground as these were the games prior to Christmas with us only winning the one game – this game was a one-day game against Sandy Bay at Queenborough with club favourite Caeden "Turtle" Workman leading us to victory with 98 runs falling short by 2 of a maiden first grade century. Sandy Bay were 2-182 seeming like Victory was theirs but some shrewd bowling from Sam Rainbird (4 wickets) and Lawrence Neil Smith (3 wickets) got us over the line.

The second half of the year saw us play 2-day cricket which was our strength. We ended up winning 6 of our 8 games in this format. We were led by Sam Rainbird and Lachie Borsboom with the ball and again Sam Rainbird, Harrison Allanby and Ryan Borsboom with the bat. There were many memorable games but against North Hobart at the TCA – the old boys wound back the clock with Allanby & Rainbird putting the dees to the sword with the bat with Rainbird ending 100 not out off 70 balls and Allanby 60 not out at the other end. Lawrence Neil Smith then took 5 wickets to give us a chance at an outright but we ended up running out of time with still another 4 wickets for an outright result.

Rainbird then starred again in a match against New Town, the Scott Mason Game. Rainbird taking 5 wickets in conjunction with Lachie Borsboom who also took 5 – but then in the second innings Rainbird ended with 8 to seal a memorable outright victory and taking home the Scott Mason medal. The season got off to a bumpy start, losing our first game in a tight match against SHSB. From there, we kicked into gear with a victory over Glenorchy, with youngsters Walter Aitken and Angus McKenzie both reaching 50. Walter and Angus backed up their performances the next week against Lindisfarne, with both players making unbeaten half-centuries in a comprehensive win. Sick of seeing the kids get all the accolades, Jacob Arkley and Jordan Smith showed their talents in our first 2-day game of the season against Glenorchy. Arkley led the charge with the ball, ripping through the top order with figures of 3/40 off 11. While we were all making our way to the next venue, our team was changing rapidly due to a couple of injuries in the higher grades. I was frantically making calls to find enough players to field 11, but thanks to Max Tew, we were able to get all members on to the park. New Town got off to a cracking start, going at close to 10 an over after 7 overs, until the Roo's struck with a remarkable one-handed catch from that man – Max Tew. This led to a New Town crumble, with their innings ending on 118 after 19 overs. With a total of 111 to chase down (thanks for a beautiful spell from Ollie Wentorf), Angus McKenzie continued his stellar season, with a remarkable 55* to get us over the line with 3 overs to spare.

This took us to the Grand Final against Kingborough, who had been the team-to-beat throughout the tournament. Kingborough posted an impressive 130 off their 20, so we knew we had a bit of work to do. Angus McKenzie did his best to get us over the line, with 47 off 39, but the Roos ended up falling agonisingly close – 7 runs shy after their 20 overs.

After the Christmas break, the Roos got back to their winning ways and included some fantastic individual performances. Colby Picket's 5/16 off 8 and Tex Gregg's 104* off 175 vs SHSB. Adrian

Dusatoy's 5/10 off 16.4 and 99 vs North Hobart. Brendan Cook's 5/37 and Nick Clark's 106* vs University. But none were better than Angus McKenzie's 109* off 143 to carry his bat against Kingborough in the last rostered game of the season, guiding us to a strong win

Our attention now turned to the semi-final vs New Town. Having finished the season on top of the ladder, the pressure was on New Town to win the game, while we needed only a draw to progress through to the final. New Town got off to a great start, and has us on the ropes at 5/62. Needing to put runs on the board and take time out of the game, it was a crucial 146-run partnership between Walter Aitken and Nick Clark that levelled the game. At the end of the days' play, the game was tightly poised with the Clarence 7/208. Day 2 went all the way of the Roos, with Bailey Shead and Lochie Craig chipping in with some lower-order runs to take our total to 293, leaving New Town the mammoth effort of chasing the runs down in about 36 overs. This never looked likely, with Bailey Shead putting on a clinic with the ball – taking 4/8 off his 6 overs. Not to be outdone, Adrian Dusautoy iced the game with 6/33, bowling out New Town for 95

This lead to a Grand Final rematch against Kingborough, and the Roos were keen to seek redemption. The scenario was similar to our semi-final, with Kingborough winning the toss and bowling, having to bowl us out to have any chance of winning the match.
